### Supply List:

\*Sewing machine in good working order with power cord, and instruction manual

Pattern – must be obtained from [Quilterscache.com](http://Quilterscache.com). The free 12" blocks are "Double Windmill 2" (very easy), "Endless Chain" (easy) or "Carol's Star" (moderate). Choose your block pattern, print the instructions and templates, decide what and how large your finished project will be; a pillow, a table runner or topper, a wall hanging or a quilt. The instructions tell you how much fabric you need to complete one block. Multiply that by how many blocks you wish to complete

Print your templates on foundation piecing paper. Regular copy paper is too heavy and will be difficult to tear away

\*Template paper – Carol Doaks is a good brand

\*Sewing supplies such as scissors, filled bobbins, ruler, rotary cutter and new blade, pins, etc.

\*Cutting mat

\*Fabric pre-cut to sizes specified on pattern. If you are unsure, can be cut in class

\*A small iron and ironing pad

\*Add a quarter ruler. This is a must have. The 12" ruler works best.

A piece of card stock paper. I use the junk mail postcards I get in my mail.
